# POLITICS AND PROTEST COLLECTION, 1968-1990

## ABSTRACT

This collection covers a few significant periods of protests and political activity in the late 20<sup>th</sup> century, such as the May 1968 protests in Paris, American student protests of the 1960s and 1970s and the German reunification of 1990. Documents include newspapers, pamphlets, flyers, article clippings and correspondence, with an emphasis on student and underground publications.

The organization of the collection arises from the disparate events it covers and is roughly divided into four categories based on geography and time period: (1) France, May 1968, (2) United States, 1960s/1970s, (3) United Kingdom, 1970s, and (4) Germany, 1989-1990, with a miscellaneous category at the end. Within these categories, particular groups and/or chronology dictate the rest of the organizational scheme.
