Lincoln Hulley (1865-1934) was born in Camden, N.J. in 1865. He left school at age 10 to work in cotton mills, and later went back to school, receiving degrees from Bucknell College in 1888 and from Harvard University in 1889. After teaching at Bucknell and the University of Chicago he became president of John B. Stetson University in DeLand, Florida, a position he held for the remainder of his life. Hulley Tower on the Stetson campus is named for him and serves as a mausoleum for Hulley and his wife, Eloise. Hulley was a prolific author of dramas and poetry and this collection contains four boxes of his writings. Many appear to be self-published.
