1911-1924 Barr Feree Pennsylvania Society Large Flat Box

Barr Feree (1862-1924) was an architect and publisher who had a strong interest in the history of architecture, especially the cathedrals of Europe. Feree was born in Pennsylvania, attended the University of Pennsylvania, and lived and worked in New York for most of his life. He also maintained a home in Demarest, New Jersey. He organized a group called the Pennsylvania Society in 1899 (originally the Pennsylvania Society of New York) and this box contains several programs from the annual dinners and other events held by that group. Several were held to honor World War I heroes. Feree's library was donated to Princeton when he died. The Marquand Library has an archive of his papers. Many of the Pennsylvania Society yearbooks are in the open stacks at Firestone, as are many pamphlets written by Feree.
