*N. B.* — If going any distance beyond the walls a bargain should be made.

The price of the course increases 20 cents in the day and 40 cents at night for every extra person more than two for the carriages of one horse, more than four for carriages of two horses.

For the carriage by the hour a third person pays nothing extra.

There is no charge for a carpet bag or any small article.

Articles of a larger size or weight 50 cents extra each.
