- 10---43 En. 7. L 10. Circe by the power of her Enchantments transforms Men into Beasts. See 10 to 19 &c
- 11---44 En. 7. L 59. Latinus & Lavinia at a Sacrifice, the Priest foretells the Arrival of a Stranger who should govern the Country.
- 8---45 En. 7. L 152. Eneas sends Ambassadors to Latinus who receives them favourably See 152 to 192 &c
- 9---46 En. 7. L 274. Latinus furnishes the Trojan Ambassadors with Horses, they return with Joy to Eneas.
- 7---47 En. 7. L 323. Juno sends the Fury Alecto to excite Discord between Latinus the Trojans & Turnus.
- 5---48 En. 7. L 481. The Trojans in hunting kill a favourite Deer which occasions the beginning of the War between them & their Countrymen.
- 3---50 En. 7. L 607. Juno opens the Gates of the Temple of Janus, Latinus being backward to do it. See 607 to 620 &c
- 4---51 En. 8. L 42. The River God Tyber appears to Eneas in a Dream, assures him of Success & Orders <sup>him</sup> to found a City where he finds a sow & 30 Pigs. See 35 to 81.
6. F. 49 En. 9. L 2. Juno sends Iris on a Message to Turnus.
- 1---52 En. 9. L 118. The Trojan Ships changed at Cybele's Command into Sea Nymphs See 80 to 130.
- 47---55 En. 9. L 159. Mezentius receives orders to set fire to the Trojan Camp
- 2---53 En. 9. L 226. The Trojans hold a Council.
- 46---54 En. 9. L 530. Turnus attacks the Trojan Fortifications & sets fire to the Gates. See 530 to 536 &c
